Before any article, I must once again thank you for your trust in me since December of last year, powerlifting has grown and developed significantly in Southeast and West Asia, and one of the reasons for that is the more attention and activity of powerlifting federations in that region.

With the development of sports in the Asian continent, the role of sponsors has become more colorful and marketing in this field has become more prosperous to the point where national federations also enjoy it, and of course, the role of the media in this regard should not be neglected.





Since 2015, when I became the president of the Asian Federation with your support, I have always emphasized the role of the media in all powerlifting activities in Asia, including competitions, training and seminars, and now I can boldly say that the matter has been completely completed and our media is very strong. It has worked and every year it has worked better than the last year.



The support of the International Powerlifting Federation and at the head of it Mr. Parage should not be mentioned. It passed easily, and in fact, considering the importance of the Asian Federation as the largest continent in the world, they have always given special support to our continent, which can be attributed to the presence of him and his colleagues from the International Powerlifting Federation, along with me and Mrs. Ip from the Asian Federation. And Mrs. Wang from the Federation of the People's Republic of China in the Asian Games pointed out the importance of this event in the Asian continent.

The World Championship in Malta was the turning point for the presence of Asian countries this year, and our representatives from the Asian continent shined on the stage of the World Championships, and with a simple comparison, we can discuss the increasing growth of powerlifting in the Asian continent.

Another success that I witnessed this year was the presence of the Deputy Secretary General of AUSF (the Asian University Sports Federation) in Asia in the first round of the Asian Cup hosted by the UAE. This tournament was also of high quality with 101 participants.





Among other events, we held a classic powerlifting competition (all age groups) under the title Arab Cup in Lebanon, which was well received.

The Asian Bench Press Championship was held in Japan with the participation of only a few countries, and one of the important reasons for that was the delay in sending the invitation from the host country, as well as the failure to issue timely visas for some participants. According to the meeting I had with the head of the Japanese Federation, this issue will be held again in 2025, hosted by Japan, but special arrangements will be made for the large presence of members of the Japanese Federation.





2023 year was highlighted as well by the first Asian African Pacific Powerlifting & Benchpress Championships in Hong Kong and we are delighted to invite our members to the 2024 APA Championships in South Africa.

The last word is that despite all the successes achieved, there are still some issues that need to be resolved as soon as possible, otherwise this speed of development of powerlifting in the Asian continent will be a problem.

The issue of doping can still be considered as the Achilles heel of the Asian Federation if the national federations do not fight with doping in a serious way.



Of course, special arrangements have been made in this regard, and an online Anti-Doping seminar was held last month, and the Secretary General of the Asian Federation Tatiana Romanova informed about this issue many times, but unfortunately, the number of participants in this online seminar was not significant, so I consider it is necessary to all national federations to be more active.

I warn you to take this matter seriously and contact the anti-doping headquarters of your country and follow WADA code with their guidance.

1. There was a discussion regarding the Media issues in Asia, question was raised by member of Indonesia. APF President Farshid Soltani pointed importance of media, and confirmed that APF spent funds in 2023 on YouTube & Goodlift only, as Instagram page development is done by Tatiana Romanova for free, and costs on Website are covered by IPF.

2. The question was raised regarding the participation in Asian & Sea Games and collaboration with OCA, and Gaston Parage and Farshid Soltani informed that all Asian nations should work seriously and we continue steps forward this issue together with IPF guidance.

3. There was discussion regarding the knee sleeves for the Long legged singlets to approve and the decision should be forwarded to the IPF EC and the rule group first.

4. There was a discussion about possibility to create separate SEA Powerlifting Federation and the IPF President Gaston Parage declined this question.



5. Vice president's Report

The year of 2023 was a critical year for Powerlifting sport and APF. The outbreak of epidemic has brought unprecedented challenges to our administrative and management affairs, competition activities. training programs and other projects. Nevertheless, many of the postponed or rescheduled activities were finally get back on track and organized successfully. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all Executive Members of the APF for their valuable contributions and opinions throughout the vear, as well as all member federations for their full dedication. With the sturdy support from our member federations, the APF could continue to focus and go all out on developing the Powerlifting sport.

6. APF Treasurer's Report

After COVID settles in all over the world, APF championships are normalized in 2023.

The main income of APF is from membership fees, surplus from championships and IPF sponsor this year.

There are 5 championships in 2023. However the number of participants are not as high as before. We try to elevate the level of Championship to higher level by inviting staff for life streaming and using the Goodlift system. In 2023, the price of air tickets is still higher than times before COVID. There are net loss in the Asian Equipped Powerlifting Championship, Asian/ Pacific/ African Combined Championship and Asian University Cup. There is a small gain in Asian Bench Press Championship. Hopefully there will be a bigger gain in Asian Classic Powerlifting ,combined with Special Olympic Event.

To decrease the expenses of APF and for better resource utilization, the less attended Championships will be combined in 2015. It is decided that the Asian Equipped Powerlifting Championship 2024 will be combined with Asian University Cup.

IPF basic coach course was held for Asian coaches in Hong Kong 2023. IPF supports the tutors' expenses. There is a net loss but it will be recovered in the coming course in 2024. Hopefully, there will be a small gain in the coming courses.

In 2024, the EC will wo4k hard to solicit sponsors that can support APF development with cash and other material support.

The income and expenses report and 2024 budget are enclosed.

9. Secretary General's Report

It is a great pleasure to welcome you at the 2023 Asian Classic Powerlifting Championships in Malaysia. We are gathered together to discuss our development plans for the future and before we start I would like to share with you the latest news of the 2023. This year is a definitely historical year of APF as we have 3 new championships that were organized for the first time and we have changes in Directory office of our Nations: India, Philippines, Brunei, Uzbekistan, Kyrgyzstan.





The great step forward we have done with the Asian University Cup that was held in Sharjah in August organized by Sharjah University and UAE Powerlifting Committee as well.

I would like to point out the significant role of the University Cup in Asian region as part of the sport promotion among the students as we had athletes from 40 Asian Universities of 11 countries. This great success would be impossible without our active leaders in National Federations who joined and promoted the event. We were delighted as well to welcome Vice Secretary General of AUSF Yan Yetong



One more Championship that was held for the first time is Asian African Pacific Powerlifting and Benchpress Championship in Hong Kong in June 2023 and I would like to thank Ip Wing Yuk and Pok Kim Won for your support and hosting. We plan to continue this initiative and next year we will meet athletes from those 3 regions in South Africa and then in Japan in 2025.



IPF Arab Cup was organized in July in Lebanon for part of Arab countries in Asia and Africa. We had a meeting with the Lebanon Powerlifting Federation Mr. Hassenen Moukaled regarding the hosting of the 2024 Asian Benchpress Championship in Beirut and had done an inspection of the facilities and the hotels.

In the beginning of this year we faced Force Marjorie situation as UAE Powerlifting Federation was unable to host the Asian Benchpress Championship in September. After my kind request to all nations to consider the hosting I received applications from 4 countries: Japan, South Korea, Lebanon and Iran. All APF Executive Committee Members voted to host the championship in Japan and I am thankful to our members for the immediate reaction to support.



9. Secretary General's Report

During our last General Assembly in Dubai I informed you about my plans for APF development.

I would like to share the results of my job in 2023:

- Official Promoter Contract and the Check list for the organizer were created to support host countries with all needed information about the hosting, this year we actively working together with Meet Directors in order to organize our tournaments more professionally.
- 2 We are actively working with the possible sponsors of the APF. Hansu Power as an IPF approved equipment brand made in China is actively working with our Nations and is able to provide 20% discounts and support to the host country of the Asian Championships
- Results are updated. There were an absence of the results from 2016 till 2019 on the website and we gathered all past results together for correct statistics. Moreover there was no change in the past results in terms of correction of Doping positive lifters and this work will be done by our Championship Secretary
- 4 APF is now more active in media and all information is posted immediately to provide the best service to our athletes. I am the admin of the official APF Instagram page from December 2022 and you can see the significant growth of the audience till 14 thousands followers
- 5 I have organized first ONLINE Asian Anti-Doping Seminar this year and believe we need to continue all our efforts in Fair Sport Education

I took part at the IPF Rule Change group discussion regarding the approval of the Long-legged singlets for the athletes who is unable to wear standard singlets due to religion or other personal reasons.

11. Championship Secretary's Report

Powerlifting Championships activities in Asia began with the Asian Equipped Championships in Alappuzha, India during 1st to 6th May 2023. We had a decent number of participation and the championship was a grand success by all means.

In 2023 June for the first time we had conducted the Asia Pacific Africa Equipped and Classic Powerlifting and Bench Press Championship in Hong Kong during 24th to 30th June 2023. In a 6-day event we had participants in all divisions across all disciplines of Powerlifting and Bench Press.

Another new era was born in the month of August of the same year, the 1st Asian Classic University Powerlifting Cup during 16th to 21st August 2023. The Sharjah University came forward and conducted the inaugural championship which was grand success.

This year's Asian Classic and Equipped Bench Press Championship was conducted in Hokkaido, Japan during 12th to 17th September 2023. The championship was well organised by Japanese Powerlifting Federation.

As a positive sign of growing popularity of Powerlifting in the globe we had a massive number of participants in the upcoming Asian Classic Championship in Malaysia with a 460 athletes over 8 days.

In the Asian continent Powerlifting is gaining popularity day by day which is evident by the overwhelming number of participants in the successive Asian Championships.

12. Sub-regional Reports – CENTRALASIA UZBEKISTAN





- From March 22 to 26 there was a double championship, the Championship of the Republic of Uzbekistan in equipped powerlifting among all ages and the Champion of the Republic of Uzbekistan in classic powerlifting among juniors (total number of participants 140 people)

- From October 16 to 22, there were 3 starts: the Championship of the Republic of Uzbekistan in classic powerlifting among subjuniors, the Championship of the Republic of Uzbekistan in classic bench press and the Cup of the Republic of Uzbekistan in open age classic powerlifting (the total number of participants: 300 people, among them 80 bench press, 100 subjuniors and 120 classic open)


- Commercial deadlift tournament end of June

2 anti-doping seminars were held from Sergey Fotiev at the championships, informative work is also being carried out on social networks about the rules, equipment, correct execution of exercises, recovery exercises etc.

In December 2022, a meeting (general assembly) was held at which the new president of the Powerlifting Federation of the Republic of Uzbekistan, Islam Islamov, was elected, and under his leadership the federation began to work much more efficiently. The federation of the city of Samarkand will be opened in Uzbekistan and at the beginning of the year it is planned to hold the first championship of the Republic in Samarkand)



12. Sub-regional Reports – CENTRAL ASIA



KAZAKHSTAN

From March 04 to March 11, the Championship of the Republic of Kazakhstan in classic and equipped bench press among all ages (open, junior, subjunior, m1, m2, m3, m4) was held in Astana. From April 03 to April 11, the Championship of the Republic of Kazakhstan in classic powerlifting among open, as well as the Championship of the Republic of Kazakhstan in equipped powerlifting among all ages (open, junior, subjunior, m1, m2, m3, m4) were held in Kunaev city.

From July 03 to July 09, the Championship of the Republic of Kazakhstan in classic and equipped powerlifting (junior, subjunior, m1, m2, m3, m4) was held in Taldykurgan, at this championship an anti-doping seminar was held from KazNADC with Galiya Dzhumabaeva.

From October 03 to October 11, the Championship of the Republic of Kazakhstan in equipped powerlifting among open was held, as well as the Championship of the Republic of Kazakhstan in classical powerlifting among all ages (open, junior, subjunior, m1, m2, m3, m4). A meeting was held at this championship (general assembly), at which the entire previous composition of the federation was approved except for the head coach, Roman Pishchaev is now being appointed as the new head coach of the Republic of Kazakhstan.



12. Sub-regional Reports – CENTRAL ASIA

CENTRAL ASIAN EVENTS:

There were two online anti-doping seminars in Central Asia with KazNADC with Maira Bakasheva and Galia Dzhumabaeva. Important to point out that the seminars were organized in Central Asian region between all nations that is a great step forward in experience sharing.

Plan for 2024:

- Promotion of clean sport without doping, IPF rules seminars, coach courses,

- continuous support of the Sub-regional Federations, combined powerlifting camping will be held in 2024

- preparation and support of the Asian Classic Powerlifting Championships, which will be held in December in Uzbekistan This year, Tajikistan and Turkmenistan were excluded from IPF membership at the congress in Malta due to the fact that they are not active, do not respond to messages and have not paid annual membership fees for years, but we continue to work and look for new representatives who will become new members of the IPF.

The South Asian affiliates of Asian Powerlifting Federation are India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh and they were requested to give a detailed report on their powerlifting activities in the respective countries during the year under report, but only Powerlifting India complied with, which is given below for information of all.

Report of Powerlifting Activities in India during 2023.

Powerlifting India was very much active in activities based on Calendar of events of International Powerlifting Federation, Asian Powerlifting Federation and Commonwealth Powerlifting Federation. National teams of India under the banner of Powerlifting India participated in the following international events.





I. International Championships participated by India during 2023.

1. Asian Sub Junior, Junior, Open & Masters (Men & Women) Equipped Powerlifting Championship 2023 to be held at Alappuzha, Kerala during 1st to 6th May 2023 and 82 competitors participated.

2. World Open, Sub Junior, Junior & Masters Classic & Equipped Bench Press Championships to be held at Sun City, South Africa during 19th to 27th May 2023 and 10 competitors participated.

3. Asia – Pacific – Africa Classic & Equipped Powerlifting & Bench Press Championships for Sub Junior, Junior, Open (Senior) & Masters (Men & Women) in Hong Kong during 24th to 30th June 2023 and 32 competitors participated.



4. Asian University Cup Powerlifting Championship on Sharja, UAE from 16th to 21st August 2023 and 5 competitors participated.

5. World Sub Junior & Junior Classic & Equipped Powerlifting Championships to be held at Romania from 24th Aug. to 03rd Sep. 2023 and 30 competitors participated.

6. World Masters Classic & Equipped Powerlifting Championships 2023 to be held in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia during

 $8-15\ \text{October}\ 2023$ and $18\ \text{competitors}\ \text{participated}.$

7. 8th World University Powerlifting Cup to be Kranjska Gora, Slovenia during 31st October to 4th November 2023 and 4 competitors participated.



II. National Championships 2023 organized in India.

Based on International Powerlifting Federation–Asian Powerlifting Federation Calendar of competitions, Powerlifting India also prepares and publishes a calendar of National Powerlifting and Bench Press championships and ensures that activities and competitions take place in systematic, free and fair manner. So also Powerlifting India ensures championships at Zonal level, State level and even at District levels too. The following were the domestic championship.

1. Federation Cup (Men & Women) Equipped Powerlifting Championship held at Jammu during 23rd to 26th February 2023 in which a total of 158 Competitors including 91 Men and 67 Women took part.

2. National Senior Me & Women Classic Powerlifting Championship held at Kozhikode, Kerala during 1st to 5th April 2023 in which total of 187 Competitors including 101 Men and 86 Women participated.

3. National Sub Junior & Junior Equipped Powerlifting Championship held at Thenkashi, Tamil Nadu during 12th to 17th May 2023 in which a total of 381 Competitors including 236 Men, 145 Women participated.

4. National Sub Junior & Junior Classic Powerlifting Championship held at Ranchi, Jharkhand during 6th to 11th June 2023 in which a total of 489 Competitors including 286 Men, 203 Women took part.

5. National Masters Men & Women Equipped Classic Powerlifting Championship held at Rajam, Andhra Pradesh during 12th to 16th July 2023 in which a total of 380 Competitors including 272 Men, 108 Women participated.

6. National Senior Men & Women Equipped Powerlifting Championship 2023 held at Kashipur, Uttarakhand during 08th to 13th August 2023 in which a total of 239 Competitors including 139 Men, 100 Women took part.

7. National Sub Junior, Junior, Senior & Masters Men & Women Equipped Bench Press Championship held at Bangalore, Karnataka during 22nd to 26th November 2023 in which a total of 1455 Competitors including 947 Men, 508 Women and participated.
